From the June edition of "The Weavings"

(The monthly Newsletter from the Diocesan Department of Spirituality)

- (i) The Bishops of England and Wales have announced that 2020 is to be a Year of the Word—with the theme, "The God who speaks." The Year will actually be soft-launched on 30 September, the Feast of St Jerome who translated the Bible into the everyday language of the time (Latin). It then takes off fully on the First Sunday of Advent. We have time in hand but this just flags up the opportunities it will offer for those who will be starting to plan ahead! More information in coming months!
- (ii) RE-DEDICATION as DOWRY OF MARY St. Mary's Cathedral Newcastle Oct 14th-16th. On March 25th 2020, England is going to be re-dedicated as the Dowry of Mary, an ancient medieval title. The first dedication of England as the Dowry of Mary was in 1381 by Richard II. The original statue of Our Lady of Walsingham, from England's national shrine, is being taken on pilgrimage from the Slipper Chapel, Walsingham to all the Cathedrals of England and Wales as part of the spiritual preparation for this event. This will be a weekend of prayer.

To mark the event and pray for our nation, the Icon Group which meets in Seaham, is going to "paint" the 20 Mysteries of the Rosary for an Exhibition which will be held in Ushaw in Spring, 2020.

Tyne and Wear Citizens Update - Just Change National Campaign

You may have seen the recent coverage on regional and national news about the Tyne and Wear Citizens Just Change Campaign. This campaign has highlighted and is seeking to address the unfairness experienced by children in receipt of free school meals. Pupils in Park View School, Chester le Street, first raised that pupils receiving free school meals don't keep any unspent remainder of their £2.30 daily allowance. Research showed that unspent money is returned to the school, local authority or private catering provider, depending on how school meals are provided. An investigation by Tyne and Wear Citizens and Citizens UK has shown that 750,000 pupils across the UK are likely to be affected with the sum of money that young people lose annually estimated to be £65 million.

Since the launch assembly of Tyne and Wear Citizens in November 2017 the Just Change Action Group has been working with schools and local authorities in our region to resolve this unfairness. Many young people in our regions schools have been involved in this campaign. One of our Diocesan schools, Carmel College Darlington, is the first school to model a new fairer system that sees money returned to pupils' school meal accounts. The Just Change Action Group of Tyne and Wear Citizens is working with other schools and local authorities to remodel their systems. You can see videos made by some of our regional young people on the Citzens UK You Tube Channel, including the video made by Park View students.




Confirmation Session - Saturday 8th
