
HEALTH

Vespers will be celebrated simultaneously at four other locations across the diocese. Mince pies and mulled wine will be available afterwards and everyone is welcome.

Health & Safety Update for church cleaners and food handlers

In order to comply with relevant health and safety legislation (The Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations - COSHH) all church cleaning products have been assessed and a form completed stating handling precautions, when using the product, protective clothing, storage, disposal and first aid measures. The main substances used are bleach, general purpose cleaners and glass cleaners. The forms are displayed in the kitchens at St. Godric's and St. Joseph's Churches and should be read by all concerned.

Please be aware that because of limited storage space it is not good practice to store more products than necessary. Also please read the storage advice on the containers to ensure they are stored correctly and in the right place.
