### PRISONS WEEK 13 -19 OCTOBER

Prisons Week is a week of prayer for the needs of those affected by prisons

- Prisoners and their families
- Victims of crime and their communities
- Those working in the criminal justice system

It was started in 1973, as a Roman Catholic initiative, by Bishop Victor Guazzelli, but is now an ecumenical movement. It's website <a href="www.prisonsweek.org">www.prisonsweek.org</a> has suitable daily prayers.

St. Cuthbert's parish, Durham, are collecting items for NEPACS to make up Toiletry and Homeless Packs for prisoners being released from Low Newton (women). NEPACS is a northeast charity that has been supporting people affected by imprisonment for 135 yrs. Finchale Partnership Outreach Group has recommended that as there are three prisons within our boundaries, parishes might wish to support this collection.

Please put any donations in the box at the back of Church on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> October. Suitable items to contribute are toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, soap, deodorant, flannels, combs etc.

The annual Prisons Week Symposium, will be held at Prior's Hall, Durham Cathedral, Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October. 9.30 - 12.45. This is an opportunity to hear experts on the subject and is highly recommended. Admission is free but places need to be booked, see Cathedral website for details about booking.




